Imagine High School Growth Plan

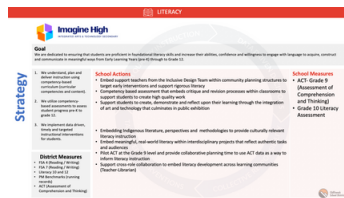

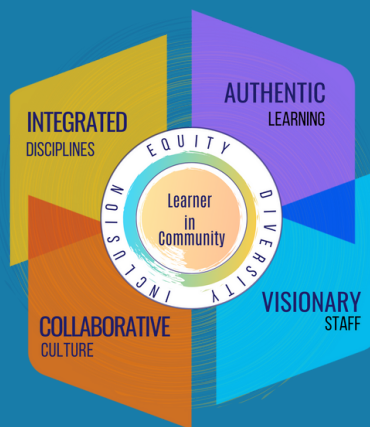


REGISTRATION OPEN FOR IMAGINE HIGH 2022/2023

Registration for the 2022/2023 school year is now open: <https://sd33.bc.ca/registration>

Availability of spaces will vary by grade, and we will have seats available for students in Grade 9, 10, and 11.

We will have space for the following for 2022-2023:
Grade 9- 150 spaces
Grade 10 - Currently full (waitlist available)
Grade 11- 100 spaces



Prior to confirming enrollment, you will receive communications from Imagine High in January 2022 sharing how to sign up for a short, 15 minute zoom connection. We ask that all new students and their families join us in a learning conversation together- we love meeting our learners ahead of time and hearing about their hopes and dreams. Students already on a waitlist do not need to re-register.



Inclusive Practices at Imagine

Assessment is in the air at Imagine and as a team we are gathering evidence of student learning through conversations, observations and products. This method of gathering is called triangulation of evidence and its purpose is to examine patterns and trends over time using daily work, planning participation, group activities and self and peer assessment as a few examples.

Evidence can be collected by the classroom teacher, education assistant, the Inclusive Design Team, the students family, and the students themselves and is used to demonstrate what the student is capable of doing throughout the learning process. Triangulation is effective for determining student learning and can show a teacher the strengths of each student and accurately determines where student learning needs to focus.

In order to ensure that students claim ownership over their learning and to listen to them regarding how they feel they are doing, the student should play an active role throughout all stages of the assessment process. Through the triangulation process, students are conferencing with teachers about their projects and discussing observations of their reading, writing and numeracy skills. Encouraging students to invest in their learning increases motivation when giving the student a voice in the assessment process.

DEEP DIVES AT IMAGINE HIGH

These intensive learning opportunities support students to hone in on personal passion areas, prepare for internships/work experience, and learn with industry standard tools. Deep Dive experiences prepare students for self-directed personalized learning projects at the Grade 11/12 level.

During Deep Dive Institutes, learning in the integrated core and elective sessions are paused.

- *Students receive 2 elective Flex credits for Deep Dives over the course of the year (not tied to a specific elective stream)*
- *During Deep Dives, students are responsible for developing goals to guide project management, provide evidence of learning, and reflect on the learning process.*
- *Full Day (Chunked activities and breaks)*
