THINKING LIKE SCIENTISTS

"Why do you think crystals grew on the outside of this container, while none grew on the inside?" asks Ms. Kuipers.


A number of students raise hands to register different guesses. Level of sunlight? Perhaps closeness to the glass? Eventually the class seems to agree that evaporation is the culprit.

A moment of relative quiet. Ms. Kuipers holds up two more containers, one with thick crystals growing inside, the other a murky white liquid. "Why do you think these crystals grew so well, while these ones hardly grew at all?" she asks.

Now it's obvious. The murky liquid has a lid, while the container with the fast-growing crystals has none. It's evaporation.

Ms. Kuipers' Earth Sciences class is learning about minerals and the formation of rocks. What better way to learn than by doing? In this simple lab, students experience the science. They ask their own questions, design their own experiments, and then reframe their experiments based on their observations. On this first experiment, most students lidded their containers; you can bet the next round will be different.

The key here isn't that they're learning about lids and crystals—it's that they're learning to think critically. They're learning to make evidence-based decisions. They're learning to think like scientists.

COMPETENCY BASED INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLANS


