DEEP DIVES ARE COMING - SELECTION CLOSES MAY 9!

Deep Dives are dynamic and engaging immersive learning institutes that offer opportunities for students to go deep into interests within specific arts and technology focus areas. During the institutes, students collaborate with peers, teachers, experts, and community creatives to partner on real-world projects and problems. These intensive learning opportunities support students to hone in on personal passion areas, prepare for internships/work experience, and learn with industry standard tools. During Deep Dive Institutes, learning in the integrated core and elective sessions are paused.

Offerings change yearly based on student interest. Past Deep Dive examples include: Fashion Design, Medieval Weaponry/Tailoring, Theatre Make-up, Baking Institute, Videogame Development, Philosophy & Film, Childcare 101, Songwriting, Musical Theatre, Photography, Outdoor Wilderness Survival and many more!

Students receive TWO elective credits for successful completion of Deep Dives. Personal Passion Projects: Students in Grade 10-12 may submit a Personal Passion Project application by the deadlines below. Approval depends on fulsomeness of application/planning and teacher references. Applications available at Welcome Center.

IMAGINE INCLUSIVE DESIGN TEAM: REFINING SUPPORTS (THE SECOND IEP PROCESS)

As the school year begins to wrap up, our Inclusive Design team is meeting with students, families, and teachers to review each student with an Individual Education Plan (IEP). This second IEP meeting is a great chance to look back at how the year has gone and to plan ahead for future transitions into higher grades and post-secondary fields.

At the start of the year, we created IEPs based on what we knew about each student—their strengths, challenges, and goals. Now that we've spent more time with them in class, we have a better understanding of what's working well and what needs to be changed. This helps us update supports and goals so they match where the student is at now. These meetings also help us look at more than just academics. We talk about social, emotional, and behavior goals too. Sometimes students are ready for more independence, and other times they may need extra help in new areas. Either way, the goal is always to help every student grow in a way that makes sense for them. The second IEP process helps everyone stay connected—students, families, and staff—so we can keep moving forward together. It also helps us start preparing early for next year, making sure each student is set up for success.
