


Build For A Better Wild

Wonder how "trippy" art can be? Art Studio can give you a glimpse. Enter into this safe space to explore, and have fun. Students will be given one main project over the two weeks, and will explore different components that can create an engaging art piece through this project. The experience will push students to think critically and reflectively when confronted with challenges, helping to build resilience and patience. Students will engage in daily artwork analysis to expand their critical and observational skills, learning to see the unfamiliar in the familiar through different lenses. Students will have the freedom to explore and advocate for their own artistic expression and will be encouraged to take creative risks, discovering that art can be the start of meaningful, reflective dialogues. Artworks will be displayed on the last day of Deep Dive to showcase the students' effort and creativity.



Video Game Music and Sound Design



In this deep dive, students will learn how to compose and arrange digital music by exploring different sound layers and instruments on Garageband. Through hands-on practice, students will also understand how music can shape a player's experience and how to match musical elements with in-game events or characters to make the gameplay more immersive.

Work with local artists from the Chilliwack Piecemakers guild and learn about the history and diversity of this art form, including traditional patterns, modern trends, the unique quilts of African-American communities like Gee's Bend, and experimental, mixed media art quilts! Discover the joy of creating beautiful, functional objects with your own two hands! Create a quilt to donate to local community charities, such as Chilliwack Hospice, Meadow Rose Society, and the Child Development Centre, as well as a smaller quilted piece for you to keep!


Game Jam

We'll discuss cults, compare trends in faith and examine how religion shapes cultures and global events. In this Deep Dive you will be participating in the planning and execution of a 2-hour outdoor musical extravaganza for Imagine High's Exhibition Day on June 24th.
