Starting this fall, Imagine High is offering a unique Grade 9 Video Game Development Program open to all SD33 students. Students will learn core subjects—Math, Science, English, Social Studies, and Career Education—through the lens of video game design, alongside electives like Computer Studies, Digital Art, Animation, and Music & Film.

Learning is hands-on, project-based, and team-oriented, with opportunities to build everything from small "jam" games to a large collaborative final project. Students will develop skills in programming, design, creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking while exploring topics such as AI, system design, storytelling, and world-building.

Assessment includes developer's logs, design documents, self-reflection, and major projects, encouraging persistence, problem-solving, and creativity. Example projects range from a historical Point & Click Adventure to a science-based platformer or a student-driven "dream project." This innovative program combines academic learning with real-world digital creation, preparing students with both subject knowledge and 21st-century competencies.

This is our third year at Imagine, and our Career Department is getting busier each year. We are pleased to offer numerous volunteer opportunities for students; however, these opportunities tend to fill up quickly!

Participation in volunteer activities is highly advantageous for students, as it enhances their resumes and supports scholarship applications. We encourage students to start volunteering as early as grade 9 to maximize these benefits and to contribute positively to our community. We advertise volunteer opportunities through our Instagram page, imagine_careercentre, as well as on the school TVs and through announcements.

We also facilitate the Work Experience Course, designed for Grade 11 and 12 students, as well as Grade 10 students starting May 1st of their Grade 10 year. This course is intended for students who are currently employed or planning to obtain employment, as well as those interested in volunteering or exploring potential careers through job shadowing and work experience.

Opportunities have included placements in fields such as welding, carpentry, baking, education, law, architecture, and more.

Students are required to complete a minimum of 100 hours of paid work, volunteer activities, or a combination of these experiences. Successful completion of the course will earn students four credits toward graduation.

SCHOOL VACCINATION INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Public health regularly checks immunization records for students in Grades 6-12 to help make sure they are up to date on vaccines. Fraser Health offer all routine vaccines needed for students in Grades 6-12 when students are in school.

Families can check their child's immunization records online to see if they need any vaccines by logging into immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/ then looking at "Immunization forecast".

This year, students, parents, or caregivers of students in Grades 6-12 have the option to provide consent for vaccines online. You can fill out consent now or any time before the school clinic. To give online consent for immunizations, scan this QR code or go to immunizationconsent.gov.bc.ca/s/.

Parents, students or caregivers who complete the online consent, will receive a letter closer to the time of school immunizations so you are aware of when the school clinic is occurring. If consent is not completed online, students will receive a letter and paper consent form from the school close to the time of immunization. The letter will let you know when the consent needs to be returned by.

INCLUSIVE DESIGN TEAM AT IMAGINE HIGH



At Imagine, we follow an Inclusive Design Framework, which means we are committed to creating classrooms and school environments where all students feel a sense of belonging: socially, emotionally, and intellectually. It's all about recognizing the diverse strengths and needs of each learner and designing learning opportunities that allow everyone to thrive. Our goal as the Inclusive Design Team is to connect with students, determine their strengths and stretches, and collaborate with teachers to support planning with an inclusive mindset that centers the needs of students. This is specially made possible by the openness and willingness of our staff to allow us into their space and work with us to reflect on practices, make thoughtful adjustments, and ensure that every student feels seen, supported, and included.

One essential way that we work to understand the needs of our students is through IEP meetings and Learning Conversations! If your student has an Individual Education Plan and you haven't signed up for IEP meeting, please reach out to your student's case manager. If your student does not require an IEP, please connect with classroom teachers to meet at our upcoming Learning Conversation night on October 22. We deeply value hearing from our students and families, as your input helps us shape meaningful learning experiences that meet each student's unique needs.

NEW STUDENT SUPPORT TEAM

Mr. Katz is joining us as the new school counsellor here at Imagine High. He is available to support you with anything academic, social-emotional, or career-related. Whether you need help solving a problem, planning your future, or just want someone to talk to, his door is always open.
